

CBDS DRESS CODE FOR INTERIM YEAR OF 2010-2011

Due to economic stressors, we are delaying the full implementation of prescribed dress until the 2011/2012 school year. During this interim period, the student dress code will be as follows:

WHY DRESS APPROPRIATELY?

Proper appearance and dress is essential to a student's success in life, how they are perceived at first impression, and how they demonstrate respect for others. CBDS requires appropriate dress in order to prepare students for life and to maintain a non-distracting learning environment conducive to quality education.

WHERE DOES STUDENT DRESS CODE APPLY?

Student dress code applies to students during the regular school hours and to those activities and programs that represent CBDS. It does not apply to athletic events.

WHAT TO WEAR?

BOYS PANTS/SHORTS:

- Navy/khaki/black pleated or plain front chino pants.
- Navy/khaki/black pleated or plain front chino shorts.
- Navy/khaki/black corduroy pants or shorts.
- Neat jeans- not tattered or faded.
- Neat cargo pants and shorts.

BOYS SHIRTS: (Any Color)

- Long sleeve/short sleeve collared shirts- Polo or rugby style.
- Long sleeve stripe or solid oxford shirt.
- Long sleeve turtleneck or mock turtleneck shirts.

GIRLS PANTS/SKIRTS:

- Navy/khaki/black chino pants.
- Navy/khaki/black dress shorts.
- Navy/khaki/black capris.
- Navy/khaki/black long chino shorts.
- Navy/khaki/black skirts.
- Dresses (any color) of appropriate length.
- Neat jeans- not tattered or faded.
- Neat cargo pants and shorts.

GIRLS SHIRTS: (Any Color)

- Long sleeve/short sleeve collared shirts- Polo or rugby style.
- $\frac{3}{4}$ or long sleeve stripe or solid oxford shirt.
- Long sleeve turtleneck or mock turtleneck shirts.
- Dress crew neck knit shirts

BOYS AND GIRLS OUTERWEAR (OPTIONAL)

- Zip-front or button cardigans.
- Cable or fine gauge vests, v-neck, or crew sweaters
- Fleece jackets or vests
- Sweatshirts with CBDS logo.

Note: *All clothing is to be without graphics of any kind, offensive and inappropriate emblems, messages, or marketing.*

WHAT NOT TO WEAR?

Clothes that are ragged, faded, too tight, too short, too revealing, or ill fitting should not be worn.

Pajamas, T-shirts, knit jogging pants, wind suit pants, nylon athletic shorts, sleeveless tops or dresses.

HOW TO LOOK?

Hairstyles should be of a natural color, clean and neatly maintained. A person's hairstyle should not be a distraction to the classroom setting nor unsafe if in a laboratory setting. Tattoos must be covered during school and all school-related activities. No body piercing jewelry is to be worn at school or school-related activities. Only girls may wear earrings. Hats and head coverings are not to be worn inside the building during school hours. Pants and shirts are to be worn as designed (example: belts loops and shirttails).

WHO'S RESPONSIBLE?

Parents are responsible for the dress code conformity of their students. Parents will be notified of dress code violations and are expected to correct the problem. Parents and students who are unable to support the dress code of CBDS may need to consider alternative school placement.

2011-2012 SCHOOL YEAR:

Full implementation of prescribed dress will be in place. The only difference is what is described above is that no jeans will be allowed and all shirts/tops will be solid color.
